



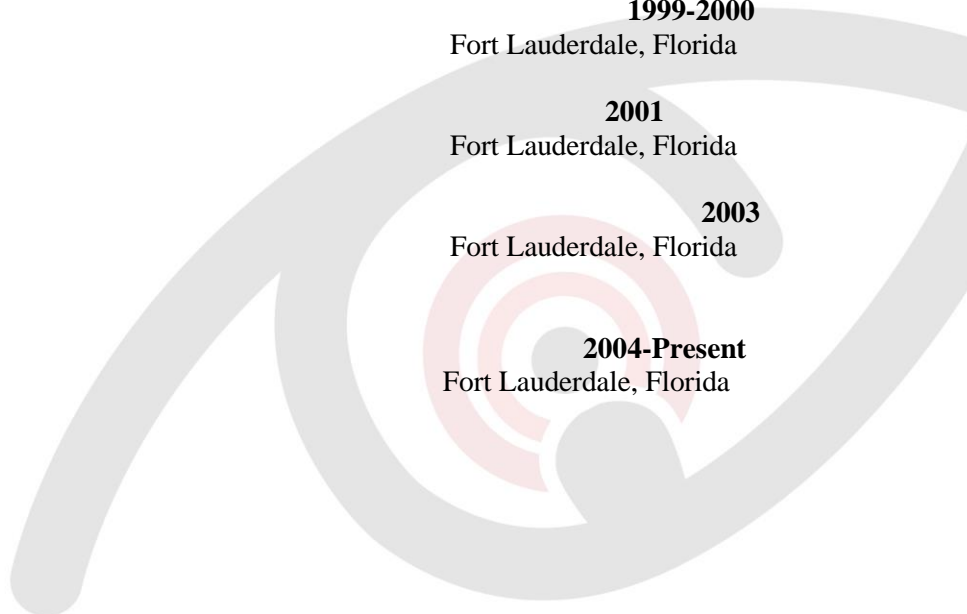

## Involvement in Learning Communities

### Academic Studies Program for Women: THE CHANGE CENTER

In my role as Dean of Student Services, I supervised THE CHANGE CENTER, a program designed to provide a support system and a unique academic model for displaced home makers, women who desired to return to college or attend college for the first time following a considerable absence from school. The center, funded by both grants and campus funds, was spearheaded by a fulltime director and a staff of full and part/time personnel. The goal of the center was to provide the necessary network of academic and student services support that displaced home makers needed to succeed in non-traditional careers. This successful program served approximately 30-50 women per term and ran successfully for over ten years at the North Campus of Miami-Dade Community College.

### Academic Studies Program for Black Males: THE CHALLENGE CENTER

In the early 1980's I observed a disturbing change in the Miami-Dade Community College student body, the enrollment of black male students had dropped to an alarming low. In fact, once the statistics were analyzed it was apparent that the concern needed to be addressed. With the support of grant and campus funds, I designed the Challenge Center, a program geared to recruit, retain and ultimately graduate black male students. The program ran successfully for over ten years and as a result, the retention and graduation of Black males increased significantly.

### Community of Learners Achieving Student Success: CLASS

I served on the Committee that designed and implemented the CLASS program at Broward Community College. The goal of the CLASS project was to create an environment where teaching and learning combined to ensure student success for high risk first term students. This learning community provided support and encouragement through planned activities, mentoring, guidance, and opportunities for personal growth and development for all participants.
